



ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL “CYCLONE AID” AT ST. CHRISTOPHER CATHOLIC SECONDARY SCHOOL

It was another successful *Cyclone Aid* at St. Christopher Catholic Secondary School, as students fanned out across the community on March 31st to collect non-perishable food items for the Inn of the Good Shepherd.
