




Living a Moral Life Strand

We are all called to a life of holiness, to be saints (saint from the Latin word *sanctus* meaning holy). At the same time, we are well aware of the fact that we do not always live a holy, moral life: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me (Psalm 51:3). The strand, **Living a Moral Life**, examines the ways we are called to be holy.

In the *Religious Education Curriculum Policy Document Grades 1-8*, we read that through the teaching of this strand we provide for our students the means with which: to make sound moral choices and judgements in both personal and social spheres of life; the formation in the virtues of the faith; an understanding of Gospel values; and, the "...building blocks for an understanding of conscience, conscience formation and human freedom ..." (page 29).

Through this strand we invite our students, through our words and actions, to walk in the footsteps of Christ, to examine what it means to be a Christian. Jesus serves as model of the call to holiness and gives us the directions for the pathway to the blessed (happy) life in Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5).

Here is the paradox: We are responsible to work towards living a life of holiness and, at the same time, we are all too aware of the fact that it is with God's grace that we can. So we work, practicing those good habits (virtues) that are in line with living a moral life, opening ourselves to the ever present grace of God.
