### ***UCC STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN FIRST-OF-ITS-KIND ART EXHIBITION AT THE THAMES ART GALLERY***

Art students from Ursuline College Chatham Catholic Secondary School will participate in a unique exhibition at the Thames Gallery.

“We are excited that our students will have the opportunity to display their unique talents in this one-of-a-kind show at the Thames Gallery,” says Gerri Brown, Principal of UCC.

The exhibition will open with a *People’s Choice Award* at a catered reception this Friday. It will run from May 10<sup>th</sup> through June 21<sup>st</sup>.

The show will feature works exploring various print-making techniques, such as relief printing, dry point etching and serigraphy. Throughout the school year, the students have explored the possibilities and limits of the print medium, to produce works of art expressing their perceptions of the world around them – specifically relationships between nature and the human condition.
