Each year, the St. Clair Catholic District School Board and its schools celebrate the gift of Catholic education and its significant contributions – not just to our communities – but to the province and to Canada. This year, Catholic Education Week will be celebrated from May  $1^{st}$  to  $6^{th}$ 

In recognition of Pope Francis' declaration of the Holy Year of Mercy, the theme this year is *Live Like Jesus: Opening Doors of Mercy*.

"This year's theme, like the Pope's declaration in this jubilee year, appeals to us to reflect as Catholics on the acts of mercy, reconciliation and forgiveness," says Dan Parr.
