# F. NEW BUSINESS

A. EQAO results for Students with Special Needs

Dr. Frank Leddy

EQAO results for Students with Special Education Needs were shared. Accurate information is obtained in looking at data and examining trends over time. Group focus/discussion on specific results was shared.

B. BIPSA Dr. Frank Leddy

Curriculum and Special Education develop board plan for improvement. Identification of gaps is key. The team develops strategies to reduce the gap. Plan for monitoring needs to be included. For special education at secondary there continues to be a lot of scribing, Grade 6 students with learning disabilities are doing well, Grade 3 students with learning disabilities are struggling. Will be doing an IEP audit and looking to embed technology into the curriculum.

C. Principals and Mental Health Strategy

Board mental health leadership team is working on strategies to support mental health and wellness. Presentation made to principals on November 5<sup>th</sup>. Input was sought through a survey. The team is collecting data via staff/student and parent surveys. Promotion of wellness and mental health is a key factor for both staff and students. Strategy will be available by March/April 2014.

A. School Wide Positive Behavior Support Update

Two schools are currently in full implementation. Two schools have received training and are set to launch in 2014. Two schools have set up positive behavior support classrooms. St. Joseph Catholic School hosted visitors from the Toronto District School Board and the Geneva Centre for Autism.

B. Ministry of Education Consultations-Alternative Programs

The Ministry Consultation was held on November 12<sup>th</sup> in London. A team of six from the SCCDSB attended and provided feedback. Discussion was around non-negotiables for alternative curriculum, sharing of current practices and the identification of skills, knowledge and characteristics this group needs to succeed after leaving school.

Classroom teachers chose mentor texts to base activities on. Mentor texts used were shared with SEAC. A brochure was sent home for families "Be Part of the Solution". Anti-Bullying/Empathy policy for the school was finalized.
