A. PRT Meeting - update

Brenden Deery

- Feb. 10 large PRT meeting was held with PRTs from each school. The main focus of the meeting was on Collaborative and Proactive Solutions. We will be moving towards using CPS more consistently in our schools. We will be using the CPS model to identify student's lagging skills. Dr. Tim Baker and our Behaviour Support Team presented the foundation of CPS. Follow up will include how we are going to develop the CPS model into our schools. The plan is to educate everyone one step at a time with the intent of providing the training/information to everyone in small chunks.
- The meeting we also included a review of the boards Pathways to Care model developed by Christine Preece.
- PRTs were also trained to administer Gifted Screening.
- Joan Martel reviewed the updates to the IEP Engine.

B. CODE Project Sara Vadovic

- Council of Directors of Education (CODE) provides money for specific projects being done in the board. Currently, grade 9 and grade 10 applied teachers are part of the project that focuses on students' needs, developing rich learning tasks, and using assistive technology. In the month of February a major focus of the CODE professional development was on class profiles, understanding student's needs, implementing class wide accommodations (based on Universal Design: necessary for one, good for all) and using student voice and choice to aid in differentiation. Time on two separate occasions was provided to teachers to meet with their PRTs and review the needs of their classes. On the spot strategies were discussed and clarification was made as needed.

D. Mental Well Being Update

Christine Preece

- Dr. Jean Clinton coming May 2 (UCC) and May 3 (to be determined at LKDSB location) to speak in both Chatham and Sarnia. These will be evening presentations (6:00-8:00). She will be talking about brain development. She will be speaking to our principals as well on May 2.
- Recently Dr. Stan Kutcher came to speak on Children's Mental Health. Topics covered were: mental health distress, disorders, and illnesses.
- Saturday, March 19th an all day event called Community Connections, led by Rebound. We have partnered with them and other community partners. This is for parents and children.
- Currently both school boards are meeting with the hospitals to have a consistent pathway from hospital back to school. The pathway would include the Mental Health and Addictions Nurse being involved in the process. The objective is to have one fluid plan.
- A survey on School Belonging will be coming out soon one for parents, one for students grades 4-8, another for students grades 9-12 and one for staff. The hope is to have the surveys out by mid April
