2. PRESENTATIONS

A. Learning Disabilities of Chatham/Kent (LDAO)

Clare Latimer

- Presentation by Heather Demers, CYW and Program Facilitator from Chatham-Kent
- The Learning Disabilities Association of Chatham-Kent is a non-profit charitable organization; annual membership available to the public
- Discussed types of learning disabilities; common signs of learning disabilities; ADHD and learning disabilities; secrets of success
- Statistics were shared: Learning disabilities affect 10% of the population; over 82 000 children identified in Ontario schools with learning disabilities
- October is Learning Disabilities Awareness Month
- Services Offered: 1:1 tutoring; assistive technology training (currently being restructured); social skills; Friends for Life; SOAR (Secondary School Preparation Course); resource library; guest presenters; awareness campaigns; advocacy support
- The Fall 2016 Newsletter as well as a brochure outlining 2016-2017 After School Programs were distributed to the SEAC members
- Important to increase the awareness of the services available through the LDAO CK amongst families, students and school staff

B. Joint Protocol for Student Achievement

Brendan Deery

- The Joint Protocol for Student Achievement (JPSA) is intended to facilitate collaboration between partnering Children's Aid Society (CAS) and school boards in their efforts to enable Kindergarten to
 - Grade 12 students who are in the care of, or receiving services from a CAS to benefit from the learning opportunities and supports available in schools and to achieve academic success.
- Parties Involved: Sarnia-Lambton Children's Aid Society; Chatham-Kent Children's Services;
 St. Clair Catholic District School Board; Lambton Kent District School Board; Conseil Scolaire Catholique Providence; Conseil Scolaire Viamonde
- The development and implementation of this Joint Protocol for Student Achievement will be done in three (3) phases:
 - Phase I September 2016 June 2017 Children and youth in the care of CAS
 Phase II September 2017 June 2018 Children in Kinship Service but not in the care of CAS
 Phase III September 2018 June 2019 Children and youth receiving services from CAS
- Focus of the parties: early intervention; keeping children and youth safe; maximize coordination of students' educational supports; work with the community to improve educational outcomes
- Realizing Educational Achievements for Children (REACH Team) is intended to be a
 proactive and preventative measure to support students before greater needs arise, as well

as support students who may be experiencing academic challenges. (Must be offered but does not have to be accepted.)

C. Initial Results of School Climate Survey

Chris Preece

- Administered for 6 weeks in April/May 2016; surveys for students, staff and parents
- 686 parent responses; 441 staff responses; 2596 students (Grade 4-8); 1325 (Grade 9-12)
- Questions related to bullying, sense of belonging, stress, mental well-being, health, accessibility, faith
- 87 reports have been produced
- Survey indicated top 3 stressors impacting elementary students well-being: bullying; people hurting others; being stressed out
- Survey indicated top 3 issues for secondary students' were feeling stressed out; pressure to do well at school; lack of respect for each other
- Parents felt bullying, friendships/relationships, and feeling scared, nervous or afraid were the 3 main issues
- Staff felt lack of respect for each other, behaviours in classrooms and social media issues were the 3 main concerns
- Next Steps: Schools asked to develop an overall goal for well-being for their School Improvement Plan (SIP) based on the results of the survey and to develop a Heathy and Safe Schools Action Plan to align with their SIP goal
