### 2. PRESENTATIONS

A. St. Clair College – Community Integration through Co-op Education program Holly Diloreto

- CICE is designed for individuals with developmental disabilities and other significant learning challenges and is primarily a transition to employment program. The program is made up of two different types of courses employability training and academic post-secondary courses. Every student will receive support by a Learning Facilitator in their academic courses and will have private support time scheduled during the week. Students will also participate in field placements during Semesters 2, 3 and 4 in their field of interest, if possible.
- Admission Requirements: OSSD, OSSC or Mature Student status (19 years of age or older);
   a developmental disability; a level of independence that does not require constant support;
   the ability to manage their own transportation to the college and placements.
- Applicant selection is based on the admission requirements, application package and interview.
- B. Autism Behaviour Science Program Lambton College

Nicole Domonchuk

- The Autism Behaviour Science Program at Lambton College is the result of advocacy work of local parents to the Ministry so that Autism specific training would be available in southwestern Ontario. One full-time instructor and several part-time instructors have delivered the program since 2007.
- Admission requirement is a college diploma or university degree in a related field. This
  includes Child and Youth Care Developmental Service Worker, Early Childhood Education,
  Social Service Worker, Therapeutic Recreation, Psychology, Child/Family Studies, Sociology,
  and Nursing. It is an 8 Month Program with a September intake. The focus of the course is
  ABA (Applied Behaviour Analysis). The Fall semester courses are Introduction to ASD,

Introduction to ABA, Working with Families and Teams, Ethics and Professionalism, Specialized Instructional Strategies, NVCI Training, and Field Placement I. The Winter semester courses are Behavioural Skill Building, Treating Challenging Behaviours, Transition Planning and Implementation, Parent and Staff Training, and Field Placement II. Future goals include broadening the scope of materials to include the geriatric population; ongoing updates to the curriculum materials to ensure students are trained in current best-practice; expanding partnerships with local school boards beyond student placements, towards ongoing training for employees; and marketing the program to university graduates who are looking for applied, job ready skills to add to their theoretical learning.

## B. Sowing the Seeds for Literacy

"Sowing the Seeds for Literacy" is a one-day conference for early years educators. This year's conference was held on Saturday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> at Lambton College Event Centre in Sarnia. The theme of the morning session was "Reading, Rhythm and Rhyme", with Kathy Reid-Naiman, a children's performer as the keynote speaker. Through fingerplays, repetitive rhymes, songs and singing games, Cathy provided a very participatory workshop. Participants chose 2 of 4 workshops for the afternoon session: Using Mindfulness to Foster Well-being in YOU and the Children for Whom You Care; Self-Regulation: The Shanker Model; Story-Time Planning; and Growing Early Literacy with New Books, Apps and e-devices. Committee Members are from the SCCDSB, the LKDSB, County of Lambton, Pathways Health Centre for Children, Lambton County Library system, Soundstart (Lambton Preschool Speech and Language Program), EarlyOn Child and Family Centre, and the Supervisor's Network of Lambton County.
