- What parents want for their children with developmental disabilities: independence, social skills (personal space, how to wait in line, how to be independent at Tim Horton's), daily living skills (cooking skills, measurement skills, entertainment (games, puzzles).
- Down Syndrome Association group of parents there to support each other. It's a non profit
 organization. The association promotes and protects the right of all individuals with Down
 Syndrome. Services through the association include speech therapy, social activities, and a
 parent support group.

B. CHYMH Assessment Tool

Chris Preece

- Chris provided an update on the supports for Mental Health in our Board. The focus is to
 think upstream and target our tier one students, through evidence based, class wide
 programs such as "Minds Up". Small groups are formed for students in tier two and support
 may be provided through the Child and Youth Workers. Tier three students (3-12 percent)
 often have individualized support through the Social Worker as well as community
 agencies/partners.
- CHYMH Child and Youth Mental Health Screener for ages 4-18. This tool is aimed at students in "tier 2". This screening instrument allows for evidence based methods to collect and input data into a software program that provides outcomes, algorithm of need and collaborative action plans. This tool is also in our community (agencies and hospitals) and with permissions families/students can have partners share this information with each other.
