ST. CLAIR CATHOLIC DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD PRESENTS 38 HONOUREES WITH ANNUAL “LIVING FAITH AWARD”

The St. Clair Catholic District School Board will honour 38 recipients with the annual *Living Faith Award of Distinction*. The award is presented annually to staff, parents, students, volunteers, administrators and parish members who, in an exemplary way, support the mission of Catholic education.

“Each year we celebrate and honour representatives of our school communities with these awards,” says Margaret Nelson, Director of Education. “These are the people who, at the grassroots level, use their gifts and their faith in so many ways to benefit our students and our schools. We are thankful for their tremendous support of the mission and vision of Catholic education.”

The *Living Faith Award of Distinction* was introduced to St. Clair Catholic schools in 2003. Each elementary school community nominates one person, secondary schools may nominate two. There is also one system-wide nomination representing administration and maintenance.

The awards will be presented at the annual Employee Recognition Celebration, which also honours St. Clair Catholic District School Board retirees and staff who have reached career milestones of 20, 25 and 30 years of service with the Board.

The Employee Recognition Celebration, including the Living Faith Awards of Distinction, will be held Thursday, October 6, 2005 at 5:00 p.m. at the Oaks Inn, 80 McNaughton Avenue, Wallaceburg. Members of the media are welcome.

Following are the names of the *Living Faith Awards of Distinction* honourees, their school communities and a brief description of their contributions to Catholic education.

Chris Kyte – *Youth Minister, Christ The King Catholic School* – Chris Kyte has been a wonderful role model for the children of our school and our parish. As Youth Minister at Our Lady Help of Christians Church, he has touched so many young people with his faith and his gift of music. Chris’ great love for the Lord has inspired many of our young people to come to know God in a new and powerful way. His dedication to our school, our parish and the community of Wallaceburg has been a great example of Christian love to many. We have truly been blessed to have known him.

Martha Gillier – *Teacher, Georges P. Vanier Catholic School* – Martha lives out her faith every day in her classroom, her parish and her family life. She is a caring educator who instills in her students the virtues of Christ’s teachings. She establishes a community of faith within her classroom, not only through Catholic teachings, but also by showing her students how to love one another, and forgive one another, as Christ loves and forgives us. Pam Kemp – *Parent, Gregory A.
