



## **UNITED WAY CAMPAIGNS GET \$5,000 BOOST FROM DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION PAUL WUBBEN**

The United Way campaigns of Chatham-Kent and Sarnia-Lambton have received a \$5,000 boost, in a donation from Paul Wubben, Director of Education for the St. Clair Catholic District School Board.

At a recent system-wide faith development day, teachers, support staff and school administrators contributed \$4,559 in a free-will offering.
