There are many exciting adventures awaiting our students this year. We are building on our work with the Golden Rule. We'll deepen our faith through examining the Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations. These expectations define our purpose as a Catholic educators and provide a compass for our students as they develop through their elementary and secondary education. We are called to nourish the giftedness of each individual and to protect the dignity of the whole person. We work, live and believe in an atmosphere of inclusiveness and we are taught to cherish our role as global stewards. Each month instead of the Golden Rule, the focus will be on a different Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectation. Kindness Rocks! campaign bumps up our work with the Golden Rule over the past few years and aligns with the Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations. Healthy wellbeing research continues to show that a proactive approach such as kindness is a significant contributor to positive wellbeing. Kindness Rocks! builds on our work with kindness lanyard in June. Each student creates a rock with a saying or quote or picture of kindness. The rocks are housed on the religion table in the classroom and when a student receives/notices a kind act/words (either done to them or to a fellow classmate) they take a rock from the table and give it to the student who did the kind act as an acknowledgment. From then on, the student with the rock can pass their rock on to someone else. With a rock for everyone, it's possible more acts of kindness can be recognized/acknowledged within a classroom. A bulletin board will be created in the hallway that will allow for acknowledgment of outside acts of kindness & to keep the messaging visible for students and families. Our Wellness Team will work with students to lead activities to encourage students to show kindness.

Thank you for your financial support last year for our many initiatives in raising funds for student activities & excursions as well as our Outdoor Play Space Upgrades. Thanks to vigorous participation in the variety of activities we were able to install a Gaga Ball pit in the junior/intermediate area, install a sandbox in the primary end, install new primary soccer posts more appropriate for our youngest learners and supplement educational excursions. We look forward to participating in some new activities this year as well as some family favorites.

# Keeping Our Schools Safe

The St. Clair Catholic District School Board has installed remotely controlled door locking systems, including cameras and intercoms, at all elementary schools. Parents and visitors are required to identify themselves at the door and sign in at the office as they enter the building. It is important to note that there may be times when our school secretary will be away from her desk for a moment and visitors may have to wait. Alternatively, parents and visitors should consider the following:
