	<ul> <li>In essence the recommendation will be that the two schools be consolidated on the St. Christopher site; this will be based on ministry funding approval.</li> <li>One significant difference from the ARC recommendation will be that the staff recommendation will name the new school St. Patrick's Catholic High School, north and south campuses, effective September 2010. This is due to several factors, including the 75 years of history of the St. Patrick's legacy. In terms of retention, St. Patrick's alumni will be more inclined to send their children to St. Patrick's on another site than to a school with another name.</li> <li>The Board being presented with two recommendations for their consideration is a good thing.</li> <li>September 15<sup>th</sup> is the date of the meeting at which the public may bring their concerns or make comment to the</li> </ul>
	Board, regarding either recommendation. <b>Anita Labadie, Chair of the Board</b> – on behalf of the Board of Trustees, thanked the ARC for their time, their commitment and discernment in this matter.
	The trustees have been in attendance at the meetings and they have heard the ARC's concerns. The Board of Trustees for the St. Clair Catholic District School Board will take to heart the ARC's concerns when it makes its decision. It has been a difficult process.
	Ms. Labadie thanked the staff at St. Patrick's Catholic High School for being so diligent in attending these meetings. Their concern for Catholic education in Sarnia has been noted. Thank you as well to the parents for coming out to see this process and to see how transparent the process has been. The transparency will again be evident in September with public input.
	Ms. Labadie concluded by thanking everyone for choosing Catholic Education.



7:55 p.m.	<b>Comment</b> – Chad Coene – St. Patrick's Teacher & Alumnus Thanked the ARC members for the time they gave. Expressed appreciation for the message the Director of Education brought tonight and the proposal that the St. Patrick's name be kept. Expressed disappointment that the ARC did not include this in its recommendation. The name of St. Patrick's is extremely important to members of the community from all walks of life, including, barbers, bank tellers, and deli retailers. The name is part of the wider Sarnia community and is integral to Catholic Education. The focus groups of both St. Patrick's and St. Christopher clearly state that the name be kept St. Patrick's (pages 32 & 33 of the focus groups report). The legacy of St. Pat's is extremely important; however, the name and legacy of St. Christopher must also be maintained, perhaps through the naming of the school chapel, or a wing of the school, or in some other significant way.
	<b>Response</b> – Mr. Galloway – The information of the focus groups is correct. It should also be noted that many of the St. Christopher alumni represented in the focus group started high school at St. Patrick's. Also note that discussions at the focus groups included keeping the name St. Patrick's, St. Christopher or a third name.
	<b>Comment</b> – Pat Lepore – Coach, Parent and graduate of St. Patrick's The history of St. Patrick's is a reason for keeping the name of St. Patrick's. Students will be bussed a long way to school and if the name of St. Patrick's is kept we will keep students, as it a name well known within and outside Lambton County. Expressed thanks for the impressive work of the ARC committee.
	<b>Question</b> – Ruth Geurts – St. Patrick's Parent What is the date of the closure?
	<b>Response</b> – Ms. Sutton – The date is unknown at this time as the Board has not made its final decision and ministry approval needs to be received; however, it is unlikely that it would happen before 2012.
	<b>Comment -</b> Ruth Geurts – St. Patrick's Parent The transition committee should include equal representation by parents, teachers, staff and students. Student considerations are the most important in this process. There should be a smooth transition for curricular and extracurricular activities.
	<b>Comment</b> – Karen Laucke – St. Patrick's teacher and not a graduate of St. Patrick's Ms. Laucke is originally from Hamilton and knew about St. Patrick's even while living there. The school's legacy and traditions are well known outside of Lambton County. There is an unwavering sense of community pride among students, teachers, alumni and the larger community, which goes beyond Lambton County. The name of St. Christopher should not be diminished in the process, so whatever can be done to preserve the school's 13 year history should be done.
	<b>Comment</b> – Barb Fisher – St. Pat's Alumni, Teacher and former Trustee Became a trustee to stop this from happening. Keeping the name of St. Patrick's is important. It is the Catholic tradition which defines this school. The Irish Miracle, teachers who do extras for students to ensure their success, the staff members who ensure that the student who is hungry gets something to eat – these things are all God's work being done at



	St. Patrick's. Many of our community leaders, both past and present, are St. Patrick's alumni.
	<b>Comment</b> – Sarah Neza - St. Patrick's Teacher and Alumni Thanked and congratulated the ARC members for the work they have undertaken. Excited that the schools are coming back together. Her family was split up when St. Christopher was formed, with siblings attending St. Christopher and she attended St. Patrick's. Great memories include a winning game at the Metro Bowl in Toronto and the Irish Miracle. Believes that with lots of prayers and support of the staff, the job of consolidation will become easier. Expressed thanks to the Director of Education for his comments and his recommendation to name the consolidated school St. Patrick's.
	<b>Comment</b> – Laurie Caruso – St. Patrick's Teacher and Alumni Proud to be teacher and graduate of St. Patrick's. Upon graduating from teachers' college she turned down other teaching opportunities until position opened on Labour Day at St. Patrick's for one semester. Tradition is a big deal. The name is well known. Expressed thanks to the Director of Education for his recommendation to keep the name St. Patrick's as the name for the new consolidated school. Expressed thanks to the members of the ARC committee for their hard work.
	<b>Comment</b> – Rhonda Vandenberg – St. Patrick's Grad and Occasional Teacher Wants her children to attend St. Patrick's because of the legacy and history. A new super school named St. Patrick's will draw more students and will also provide a strong pull for elementary student retention in our system. St. Patrick's name will keep Catholic education alive in Sarnia.
	<b>Comment</b> – Laurie Caruso – St. Patrick's Teacher and Alumni Expressed excitement about schools blending together, great for Catholic education in Sarnia. Supports keeping the St. Patrick's name for the new school. The Fighting Irish won lots of championships. Bringing the schools together will draw more students. This needs to be done quickly with one uniform and one powerhouse school that will start winning championships again.
	<b>Comment</b> – Katie Beauregard – St. Patrick's Student Very proud to be St. Patrick's student. The PEOPEL program is very beneficial to all students, an incredible learning experience and needs to be kept at the new school. It has helped her with decisions in relation to service to others as well as her post-secondary choices.
