#### 3. Information/Discussion Items

- a) School Presentations of the School/Parish/Home Relationship Initiative (Appendix 1)
  - The Director of Education opened this topic by explaining the School/Parish/Home Relationship Initiative.
  - Dan Moynihan: plan was laid out in November. Work has inspired others across the Diocese. Huron Perth CDSB is now following our lead and Windsor Essex CDSB is also beginning this work.
  - Bishop Fabbro expressed his pleasure at being asked to attend this meeting. He was pleased to offer his support for the initiative of the home school and parish tirade.
- b) Kingdom Assignment Cindy Waddick, Elementary Chaplaincy Leader
  - Based on the parable of talents, Matthew 25 each student is given \$100.00. Their task was to use the money to do something outside the walls of the school to further God's Kingdom.
  - The United Way is the recipient of any moneys made.
  - The seed money donated by St. Clair Catholic District School Board's Director of Education.
  - A variety of activities were undertaken
  - As friends and advocates of Catholic Education our Board is donating \$2,000 to two
    other school boards to create the Kingdom Assignments in their boards and then they
    will give back the \$2,000 for us to give to two other school boards and in this way we
    will slowly get this out to all of the Catholic Boards in Ontario
- c) Muskoka Woods Gerri Brown, Principal UCC
  - Two weeks ago Parents, Trustees, K of C, and Priests went to experience Muskoka Woods.
  - Camp is located on Lake Rosseau in Muskoka.
  - The purpose of the camp is to promote awareness and importance of youth participation in outdoor recreation activities; provide our students with the opportunity for leadership

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training and the development of cooperative skills (teamwork); provide our students with the opportunity for personal growth and confidence through recreational activities.

- Catholic schools are about supporting parents to provide values to their children in a society which often does not support them.
- Attending this meeting was an uplifting experience.
- Bishop Fabbro has been to Muskoka Woods and the experience was incredible the values which can be conveyed in four day experience is unbelievable.
- Grade 7 students are changed by this experience.
- Challenge for us is to have concrete experiences to bring together school, home, and parish. Developing gospel values in our students outreach to the poor, students getting their parents to attend Mass, times together with parish staff and parents and students are worthwhile goals.
- Dan has connected our Diocese together with our Catholic Schools. This is a sign of hope for the future.
