## 2. Mental Health Strategy

L. Demers, Principal-Special Education

- ➤ Ms. L. Demers opened this part of the meeting
  - The group will be presenting a 3 part presentation:
    - An overview of Ontario Mental Health Strategy, *Open Minds*, *Healthy Minds*
    - We have a 3 year plan which has begun with hiring Mental Health workers who are currently in selected schools.
    - 8 Mental Health Nurses have been hired and are responsible for the area from Windsor to Chatham-Kent and all school boards within that area.
  - Presentation of the *St. Clair Catholic District School Board Mental Health Plan* which follows the Provincial outline promoting the coming together of Community Agencies, School Boards and Health Care settings.
  - Anxiety: How to help anxious children.

## 3. Strong Catholic Families: Strong Catholic Youth

C. Bryden, Trustee

- > Every year Ministry of Education gives parent groups the opportunity to apply for grants to work with other parent groups
- ➤ This year 3 school boards, London District Catholic School Board, Huron-Perth Catholic District School Board and St. Clair Catholic District School Board have come together and have applied for this grant Nutrient Resiliency in Catholic Families.
- ➤ 1<sup>st</sup> part of this 3 part event is to invite 2 people from every school, the Parent Council Chair and one other person, to come on to a presentation by Dr. Ferguson, who is one of the authors of the Ontario Strategy on Mental Health. This presentation will be on November 20, 2012 at the Four Points Sheraton in London beginning at 6 p.m. with dinner, Dr. Ferguson and others will speak that evening on Resiliency in the Family.
- ➤ 2<sup>nd</sup> part will be in January 2013 and will be hosted by the St. Clair Catholic District School Board and will be open to all families.
- > 3<sup>rd</sup> part will be held in May 2013 and will also be open to all families.

4. OAPCE J. Van Den Enden

- ➤ J. Van Den Enden is the Regional Representative for Ontario Association of Parents in Catholic Education
- > Organization was begun in Windsor by Monsignor Pheeney.

# 5. Amalgamation

P. Wubben,

**Director of Education** 

> Premier Dalton McGuinty has as of this evening resigned, so everything may change.

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- ➤ 1968 69 was first amalgamation in Ontario
- > 1997 was the second amalgamation
- ➤ Since 1997 St. Clair Catholic District School Board has had declining enrolment.
- > Small boards are deemed to be less efficient.
- ➤ The budget announcement, last March (2012), there was a small note of amalgamation. The reason is to reduce Administration and Trustees costs as most of the board's expenditures goes into salaries.
- > We have no other information at this time.
- April 2012, the Minister of Education spoke to **Council of Ontario Directors of Education** (**CODE**) and they were told amalgamation would be voluntary.
- ➤ July 2012, the Assistant Deputy Minister said boards would have information by the end of September 2012; nothing has come forth as of this date.
- > School Boards with populations under 16,000 are the boards being considered for amalgamation.
- > These smaller boards may choose their partners for amalgamation this falls to the Directors of Education to discuss.
- ➤ St. Clair Catholic will be one of the Boards which will be amalgamated. Windsor-Essex Catholic District School Board, Huron-Perth Catholic District School Board as well as London District Catholic School Board also have declining enrolments.
- Amalgamation will not have much effect on schools but will have an effect on the staff of the CEC.
- Information is expected in the next few weeks but with tonight's announcement that may change that timeline.

#### 6. Provincial Labour Issues

C. Bryden, Trustee & P. Wubben, Director of Education

- ➤ Ms. C. Bryden from trustee point of view province has lead a discussion table around agreements for employees. The province has acted as a lead. In the past the agreements have always been struck between the boards and the employee group.
- Mr. P. Wubben This year the government has signed an agreement with the Ontario English Catholic Association. This board does not have an agreement with its teachers. The teachers have an agreement with the government. The board is not pleased with this turn of events. Our teachers are providing the extracurricular activities.
- Everyone in our schools and our board are working as usual. If the public secondary school teachers pull their extracurricular activities then that would have an impact on our schools extracurricular activities because it would affect who our schools could play.
- ➤ If no agreements are signed before December 31<sup>st</sup> then the government will impose agreements.
- Next year 3 PA days will be unpaid as determined by Minister.

# 7. Consolidation of St. Christopher Catholic Secondary School And St. Patrick's Catholic High School

P. Wubben, Director of Education

- ➤ In 2008 the board approved an ARC and in the Spring 2009 recommended the closure of the school on East Street North, Sarnia. In November 2009 the board decided to close one of two secondary schools in Sarnia, to keep the site at Rapid Pkwy open and to name the school St. Patrick's Catholic High School provided that Ministry funding was forthcoming. In June 2011 we received 12 million to build on the Rapid Pkwy site.
- ➤ Consultation process began in the Spring 2012 and in order to meet the needs of the school it was decided that major renovations to the existing school would need to be done. Safety of students

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- and staff and programming would be compromised during the extensive renovations and new build.
- ➤ It was decided to move all staff and students to the East Street site as a site which will work as a temporary location. There are difficulties with this plan which have been and will continue to be acknowledged; these will be worked through.
