A self-directed, responsible, lifelong learner who develops and demonstrates their God-given potential.

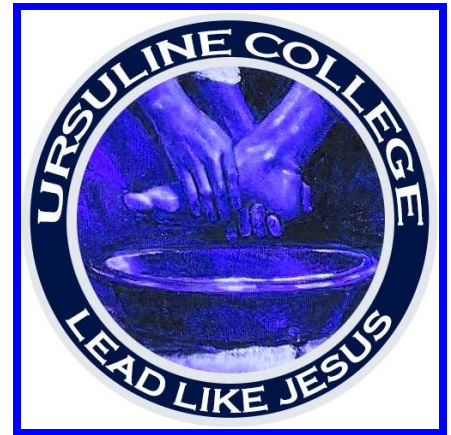
**A Collaborative Contributor**
