St. Clair Summer Learning Opportunities 2020-2021

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Background

For the second year, St. Clair offered virtual summer learning opportunities for elementary students. Camp was a joint endeavour which included curriculum, special education and student support team staff joining together to plan and implement a supportive, inclusive summer learning experience. Our multidisciplinary teams included 2 teachers, 1 child and youth worker/social worker, and 1 educational assistant in each cabin. Funding for the camp was provided through a variety of sources including CODE Summer Learning grant, Special education and Mental Health and Wellbeing funding and Ministry funding to support destreaming grade 9 mathematics.

Elementary Summer School 2021

In elementary, we offered opportunities for early years to grade 8. See the chart below:

Students engaged in camp July 5th through 23th from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. daily. Using a synchronous model of instruction, staff and students came together in a Google Meet each morning. Students benefited from a multidisciplinary approach that supported both their wellbeing and learning needs.

Staff had the opportunity to connect and learn new skills from 11:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. on a daily basis. A variety of digital applications including Flipgrid, Jamboard, Bitmoji classroom, Interactive Google Slides and G Suite tools were employed to offer students an opportunity to share their thinking in both written and audio form.

Secondary Summer School 2021

Summer school was entirely online again last July and August. Students were offered: Courses taught by SCCDSB teachers; Dual Credit Courses at both St Clair and Lambton Colleges; Co-op courses with in-person placements; and External elearning courses with a Catholic Consortium and the "mixed" consortium.

Transition To Secondary School Initiatives

Head Start Summer 2021

The goals of the Head Start Program are:



To provide students an opportunity to have a smooth transition into secondary school

To introduce the students to teachers they will encounter in their Grade 9 year

To introduce courses in various pathways that are available to students in their Secondary school.

Head Start was originally offered to students who were enrolled in Grade 9 Applied Mathematics courses in the Spring of their Grade 8 year. This year with the advent of destreaming in Mathematics courses, all students entering an SCCDSB Secondary school were invited to attend the three-day event offered at UCC and St. Patrick's, Aug 24-26th.

A typical Head Start day began at 8:30AM with 90 min of engaging Numeracy Activities, followed by a snack break. The next sessions included 2-1 hour "Elective Programming" where students engaged in hands-on activities in Physical Education, Arts, Computer Programming, Culinary Arts and Skills and Technology and more.
