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Subject: French Immersion Program Update

Background

On November 28, 2017, the Board of Trustees received a report that highlighted French Immersion was a growing program. This report seven years later provides an update.

French Immersion has continued to grow in popularity. In 2017 the Board stated our hope was availability of French Immersion programming to all interested Catholic families and stressed the importance of adhering to the KinderSTARt registration timelines. The Board confirmed that any registrations received after February 28 each year for the following school year would be considered late registrations and only considered alongside a review of the capacity of the school. All Catholic families that have registered for French Immersion programming have been approved up to and including for the 2024-25 school year.

Following the cycle of registrations for the 2024-25 school year, senior administration recognized that additional admissions processes and criteria must be established by the Board for French Immersion programs to ensure school capacities are not exceeded over the long-term. Regardless of the additional processes and criteria and at the discretion of the Board, Junior Kindergarten admission requests may be given priority where siblings are enrolled at the same school. It continues to be our Board's strong belief that families are best served by keeping them at the same elementary school. The Board's Admission of Students procedure will be updated. These additional processes and criteria may result in some families having to register in English programs and being placed on a waitlist for French Immersion programming.

The Board's Associate Director responsible for admissions and planning, along with the Superintendent of Education responsible for French Immersion program and K-12 Consultant for French Immersion programming, visited our four elementary French Immersion Catholic School Advisory Councils to ensure collaboration with parents, guardians and school administrators. This collaboration has informed additional processes and criteria for the 2025-26 junior kindergarten registrations. The dates of the meetings attended are noted below.

Christ the King Catholic School – October 2, 2024 Monsignor Uyen Catholic School – October 8, 2024 St. Anne Catholic School, Blenheim – November 6, 2024 Gregory A. Hogan Catholic School – November 27, 2024





After careful analysis of school capacities, Junior Kindergarten enrolment caps for 2025-26 have been set as follows, and may be reassessed each year:

Christ the King – 27 Gregory A. Hogan – 67 Monsignor Uyen – 42 St. Anne Blenheim – 24

The projections provided in this report were created in November 2024 and include the enrolment cap for each French Immersion school.

Christ the King

Christ the King became a full French Immersion school for the first time in the 2024-25 school year. with the additions of new grades offering French Immersion throughout the past 5 years, Christ the King continued to grow, increasing from 131 students to 231. Projections, as indicated in the table below suggest stabilization of enrolment going forward, and the cap of 27 pupils is not currently projected to be reached.

Gregory A. Hogan

Gregory A. Hogan has continued to show growth, increasing from 529 students in 2019 to 617 in 2024. Most of the growth has occurred in the past 2 years. Projections suggest continued growth in French Immersion in Sarnia. The cap of 67 is not currently projected to be reached in Junior Kindergarten, however, it may limit the number of student additions in other grades throughout the years.

Monsignor Uyen

Monsignor Uyen has increased from 305 students to 391 students in the past five years, with the majority of the growth occurring in the past two years. Projections indicate continued growth in French Immersion at this school, as indicated in the tables below. The cap of 42 is currently projected to be reached in Junior Kindergarten for the next five years.

French Immersion in Blenheim has seen slight growth, moving from 158 students in 2019 to 168 students in 2024. Projections illustrate enrolment will continue to grow slightly over the next few years. The cap of 24 is not currently projected to be reached in Junior Kindergarten.

<u>Ursuline College Chatham Catholic Secondary School</u>

Ursuline College's French immersion program has remained relatively stable in the past five years, with growth occurring in 2024-25. Overall, the program has grown from 127 students to 145 students in the past five years. Projections indicate the program will continue to grow. The growth is partly due to Christ the King beginning to have graduates attending secondary school in the 2025-26 school year.
