



Sale of Former Monsignor Uyen Catholic School, Chatham

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Background

A Report to the Board of Trustees, *Declaration of Surplus Property and Property Disposal Process*, was presented on September 24, 2019. At this time, the Board of Trustees approved a motion that declared Monsignor Uyen Catholic School, Chatham surplus to the needs of the Board.

A Report to the Board of Trustees was presented on November 12, 2019 to clarify the list of Preferred Agents as identified in Ontario Regulation 444/98.

On November 13, 2019 the Board provided a proposal to the Preferred Agents offering the surplus properties at fair market value. The due date for Preferred Agents expressions of interest was February 11, 2020.

On February 11, 2020 the Board received no expression of interest from the Preferred Agents as identified in Ontario Regulation 444/98 for Monsignor Uyen Catholic School.

As noted in the previous Report to the Board of Trustees describing the disposition of surplus property, the Board is disposing of entrusted property assets and therefore has a Trustee fiduciary responsibility that effective public sector governance is clearly demonstrated. The Board must be in full compliance with all Legislative and Regulatory requirements, meaning that directions and decisions are clearly articulated in a timely fashion to the Preferred Agents as identified in Ontario Regulation 444/98 and the community at large.

On November 10, 2021 the Board issued a Request for Offers (RFO) to the open public in order to solicit offers to purchase Monsignor Uyen Catholic School.

The RFO closing date was December 2, 2021. At 3 p.m. on December 2, 2021 administrative staff and the Board's solicitor Ed Litrenta of George, Murray, Shipley, Bell LLP opened the sealed submissions by way of a TEAMS meeting with cameras on. At the conclusion of the submission

opened copies of the offers were sent to Ed Litrenta for a full review and summary.

On December 3, 2021, Mr. Litrenta advised that after his review of submissions, all submissions received were in order, signed and dated as required by the RFO document.

After reviewing submissions in relation to the estimated market value of Monsignor Uyen Catholic School, the Board will engage a real estate agent for the sale of the school.

Recommendation
