What are the important parts of our conversation that we want to preserve and take forward into the Symposium?

Significant that there are so many Catholic groups coming together and we are united
Challenges should be seen as a good thing because they are keeping us moving and asking questions - challenges are invitations - by coming together we are looking at the gifts/treasure of the schools and how we can make them even better

- Importance of having strong staff faith practice that can work with students to be faith leaders even if their peer group is not as engaged

- How do we continue to look for creative ways to engage our students, staff, families (whole community) in today's world?

- Follow teachers because they are witnesses of the faith; faith is caught not taught

What are some entrenched or fixed perspectives that we most need to recognize, understand or change?

How do we speak to our uniqueness, our ability to live our faith, without sensationalizing it? We need to be able to name it with confidence. We do these things because of our faith.

Big difference between our Catholic system is that it's about an environment, not a religion course- our student's faith is a part of every aspect of their life

Our school is part of the entire Catholic church- we work together within the Catholic Church

When it comes to a person's family of faith, sometimes the school is the Church.

When we talk about who we are and we do it with humility, we can discern who Publicly funded Catholic education- we are assuming this is the best model- are we in a better spot now that we are publicly funded?

What 1 or 2 possibilities for change might best support Catholic education moving forward?

We have to see the Catholic school system as a mission ground, having many people to inspire and be inspired by.

Mindset – doesn't have to be an either or- inclusivity or distinct/unique We either have to be inclusive or we have to be distinct- it is not either or BUT ANDproclaiming our distinction/uniqueness- we are proclaiming Christ – Christ centered

One thing that didn't come out in this document- fewer priests/nuns We should rally more clergy support to the school- provide opportunity to evangelize within the school- that's where the students are Deacons within the schools is very positive

When asked what has to be changed, doesn't have to be a negative but rather embrace/improve upon what we already have
