St. Clair Catholic Schools Help Local Food Banks with Farm Credit Canada's "Drive Away Hunger" Campaign

Staff and students in the St. Clair Catholic District School Board helped local food banks with generous donations of non-perishable food items, through a partnership with Farm Credit Canada's *Drive Away Hunger Campaign*.
