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# NEW POLICY CONFORMS WITH ONTARIO LAW TO BAN HAND HELD DEVICES WHILE DRIVING MOTOR VEHICLES

Trustees for the St. Clair Catholic District School Board have approved a new policy, which mirrors legislation passed recently by the Ontario government. Policy 4.24 - Use of Hand Held Devices While Driving prohibits the use of cell phones and blackberries by Board employees while driving on Board business or by volunteers transporting students in motor vehicles.

"We support this important legislation which will result in fewer distracted drivers on the roads and we have backed it up with policy," says Paul Wubben, Director of Education. "Safety of our staff and our students is always our number one priority."

Only hands-free communication devices are permitted for use while driving. In situations where students are being transported, either by staff or volunteers, no communication devices are to be used – including hands-free technology, except in a case of emergency.

All employees were notified by memorandum last week that Bill 118, the *Countering Distracted Driving and Promoting Green Transportation Highway Traffic Act* would come into effect on October 26, 2009.

Policy 4.24 takes effect on October 28th.



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# 41 ST. CLAIR CATHOLIC STUDENTS NAMED WINNERS IN ANNUAL QUEEN ELIZABETH II SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

41 students from St. Clair Catholic's three high schools have been named recipients of the Queen Elizabeth II Scholarship. The scholarship is awarded by the Ontario government to students who graduate from secondary school with high marks and who plan to continue their studies at a college or university in Ontario. The scholarships are intended both to recognize academic achievement and to provide financial support.

Each scholarship is worth a maximum of \$3,500 per year, for up to four years, as long as the student maintains an 80 per cent average in their post secondary studies.

"We are proud of our students' accomplishments and are pleased that they are being recognized in this way," says Paul Wubben, Director of Education. "We wish them the very best in their post secondary careers."
