Chatham artist Mark Reinhart has created a 'thank you' message for frontline healthcare workers that is displayed on a wall at Ursuline College, directly across from Chatham-Kent Health Alliance. Teachers will also be creating and sharing ideas with students for art at home.

"The heart is the perfect symbol to say that we are praying for each other, for ourselves and for our global community and that with God to lead us, we will all come through this together," says Mrs. Crawford. "Let's join our heARTs, connect with each other and be the voice of encouragement and hope that we all need during these uncertain days!"
