  - Michael sits on the board for Community Living Welland-Pelham and has been elected Vice President for the Board of Directors with Community Living Ontario
  - Michael was chosen as Fonthill's 2019 Citizen of the Year
  - As a young leader and public speaker, Michael has received international recognition on the Queen's Commonwealth Trust
