B. PRESENTATIONS

1. Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder

Esther Trapp, Chatham-Kent Children's Treatment Centre Karen Holland, Pathways Centre

Karen and Esther's presentation shared the following information:

- FASD is a permanent disorganization and impairment in the brain / FASD is not rare a conservative estimate is 4% of the Canadian population has FASD.
- Diagnostic Criteria getting a dx is a complex process.
- 10 Brain Domains the capacity of the individual in each of these brain domains is measured during the assessment and in making the dx. The brain differences have an impact on behaviour and earning. There are overlapping characteristics with other diagnoses such as ODD and ADHD. Chronological age and developmental level do not match which affect both cognitive skills and social impairments. Early identification is important so that interventions can begin.
- A.L.A.R.M.S. = Adaption, Language, Attention, Reasoning, Memory, Sensory. These 6 categories represent primary behaviours of persons with FASD.
- Reframing the Behaviour when you see behaviour, think BRAIN not BLAME.
 Students do well if they can. 8 Keys are strategies that work with individuals with FASD. They are: Concrete, Consistency, Repetition, Routine, Simplicity, Specific, Structure, and Supervision. In the centre of the 8 keys, and most importantly, is a trusting relationship in all environments. It is important to use a strength based approach using the individual's strengths and interests.





- FASD & Mental Health Trauma and attachment are often associated with FASD.
 Trauma is the primary reason for behaviour issues. Attunement is important to create a 2 person experience where the individual can borrow your safety.
- FASD Referrals SCCDSB has access to 2 FASD coordinators at each of CTC-CK and Pathways Centre for Children in SL. Referrals can be made by school teams, family service providers and families.
- FASD Resources Books, websites and training information was provided.

- The numbers trend upward. The 2023-24 data is the highest to date with a total of 21 students with moderate to high needs entering school in the Sarnia Lambton area and 20 students with moderate to high needs entering school in the Chatham Kent area.
