#### **READING AND WRITING MILESTONES**

#### As your child continues to grow as a reader and writer

*Critical literacy* is the practice of examining and discussing the underlying messages, in print or in other media, in order to understand the world in which we live. Children are practising critical literacy skills when they think about the purposes for writing and talk about how texts (that includes books, websites, magazines, posters and so on) represent different points of view, beliefs and perspectives. In this stage, your child:

- Is able to read and understand different types of texts more precisely and quickly and with expression;
- Is able to read, write and create a variety of media to express opinions and points of view (such as creating and watching videos, blogging, and reading graphic novels);
- Is interested in the social aspect of reading and writing and enjoys sharing thoughts and ideas about the texts he or she chooses (such as by sharing ideas in discussion with friends, on social media sites and through instant messaging).

Dear Parent/Guardian,

As has been the case in past years, I would like to draw your attention to the Board's practice of not publishing class lists before staffing is completed at the end of August.

Over the course of the summer we will see a number of students move from one school to another. The impact of this is that we never know exactly how many students will be present on the first day of school. With the class size cap or limit, just one new student could push a class size over the threshold of 20, creating a "domino effect" which would result in changes to several classes at every grade level in the school. School organizations are now driven by the provincial formula, one which we are obliged to apply. Therefore, principals have been instructed not to post class lists prior to the beginning of school and to advise their communities and staff that regardless of the way the numbers look in June, they should assume that class configurations and the school organization could well change early in the school year.

Despite these challenges, we at St. Clair Catholic believe the class-size caps are good for our students and for our teachers. The limits will give teachers more time to devote to one-on-one instruction, which will only enhance the quality education students are already receiving in our classrooms.

Our Principals will be working with staff at the Catholic Education Centre over the summer months to organize classrooms as per this directive. I ask for your patience and understanding in the early days of the new school year, as we do our best to meet this mandate with as little disruption as possible to students.
