## **Specialist High Skills Major - Presentation**

- Handout provided with more detail on various programs. Embarking on a new branding campaign. Program is ~ 10 yr old initiative from the Ministry of Education. Pathway planning with 7 items listed in newsletter for highest employable fields.
- If 5 requirements are completed, diploma will show they have completed in their sector of choice. Typically apply fall of grade 11 year.
- Website will contain more information. Logos, multimedia, posters around the school will help bring awareness to program availability.
- No cost to students, ministry funded. 2 period co-ops required, encourage summer co-op to take advantage.

## Chaplain Update (J. Palko) – No report

### Numeracy Report (J. Majeski)

- EQAO Math grade 9 Jan 21-22
- Presentation given. Encourages student voice, numeracy skills beyond math. Role created to work with teachers to co-plan and co-teach lessons.
- School numeracy goal is to show importance of skills for the future.
- AEAC achieving excellence in applied courses. Predict student achievement 2x per year, teacher expectations have a large effect on overall student achievement. Positive belief = positive outcome.

### **Literacy Report** (E. Moffat Sharpe)

- Presentation literacy support teacher
- OCA diagnostic from Ministry of Education, 1 hr, linked to skills and curriculum; gives a sample of writing, not just the answer but how you arrived there. Helps identify gap in skills.
- Intention is to support students and develop lifelong readers, encourage independent reading outside the classroom.
- EQAO data summarized. 94% of students indicate they have reading materials available at home. 93% state they read <1 hr per week for pleasure. Most popular forms of reading material are novels and poetry. 40% of students need to utilize a computer 1-2 times per week.
- Overall, St. Pats is above provincial average. School improvement plan and goal is for Level 3+ work.
