#### **Grade 9 Orientation Day- August 31**




#### Positivity Day-September 11

#### **Terry Fox Day- September 15**

September 15th was dedicated to the true Canadian hero, Terry Fox. Throughout the week, Taylor Scott and Kelsey Clark were two St. Patrick's students that inspired staff and students alike with their motivational stories. Both students have been directly affected by cancer and they graciously offered to share

their personal journeys in order to advocate about the importance of cancer research. During the week, both students were involved in various Q&A sessions that were shown live on the morning announcements. Their personal stories allowed the entire school community to truly see how cancer touches the lives of everyone, whether directly or indirectly. Inspired by Terry Fox running 42 kilometers each day during his Marathon of Hope, Student Council challenged every homeroom class to raise \$42 through the campaign, "Toonies 4 Terry." The goal was met, and over \$2,800 was raised for cancer research. Taylor Scott was chosen as the ambassador for St. Patrick's and presented the check to representatives at the local Terry Fox run taken place on September 17th.
