Committee Reports

Board Liaison (T. Brown)

Making an effort to have more people participate. Mental health may be a focus for the year. Will continue to push for parents to attend.

Safe Schools Committee / Sabrina/Ryan's Laws (C. Blair)

Emergency Response (ER) team is up and running with approx. 14 members. All are trained to respond to many situations including medical emergency code green.

Sabrina's Law – anaphylaxis and epi pens are available.

Ryan's Law – students with asthma may carry inhalers with them.

School has had a fire drill and lockdown drills already this year.

The safe schools committee met with student council and have looked at school climate data. Results will shape items for the year. 36% feel 'successful' at school. Group has started the conversation about how to change that looking for themes or events. Will tie into chaplaincy efforts.

Student success teacher – completed survey of grad 9 homeroom. Data has been complied and was shared with staff today. Using the survey to gauge where students are coming in and their need to help target ways to address concerns.

Suggestion to consider reaching our for sponsorship opportunities for training and materials such as for CPR to local corporations.

Uniform Committee (E. Moffat Sharpe)

Contract details are being worked through with McCarthy. Some limitations were placed ahead of the start of year as the goal was to ensure a full set or core set was available to each student to start the year.

Pro Grant Committee (C. Monteiro, C. Prasad, J. Hubbard)

Our application was submitted and approved for \$750. Goal is to do a few events through the year. Discussion on the parent/student My Blueprint event. Suggestion is to try the event again this year. Requested group to bring ideas to the next meeting.

Graduate Acknowledge Committee (M. Williams)

Garden box is beautiful; some harvesting to be done. Total donation \$530 by grads and council; Walmart \$1,000; Home Depot \$100. Next idea is to put a compost program together.

Vice-Principal's Reports

Literacy (E. Moffat Sharpe)

Literacy test results to be published soon. Will start to work on intervention. 2018 test is scheduled for Tues April 10.

Numeracy (F. Torti)

Numeracy assessment grade 9 – will remain 5% of final grade for academic or 15% of applied track to take place of exam; 2 day assessment. Jan 18-19 tentative timing. Results are coming out this week. Students should receive in home room. Oct 2 extra help will start on M/W 2:30-3:30 for any grade 9 or 10 student.

New support teacher will look through data to target key areas. The teacher will work with all math teachers.

Principal's Report (R. Cicchelli)

School start up and culture – start up has been quite good; 1350 students with 349 grade 9's. It has been a smooth transition. The school is growing and 5 permanent teachers have been added.

Focus on 'The Golden Rule'. Student council and students are challenged – it starts with you. Be the
