#### 6.0 Guest Presentation - myBlueprint - Warren Seton

Warren walked our group through a presentation on how our students navigate **MyBlueprint**. In 2016 the Ministry Education created the platform to enhance students' involvement in career research/pathways. Our students (Gr 7-12) use My Blueprint to explore and choose their highschool classes. The students all have links to their accounts. Parents have two options to become part of the process: Parents can actively link to their child's account or they can explore/test it out. The students complete a variety of surveys to identify their individual learning style. Then study tips and feedback are given to help improve the study habits. My Blueprint can be used throughout highschool to modify/adjust their original career path. The program is also very helpful to ensure Post Secondary program requirements are met. Grade 7 & 8 students are introduced to the platform at elementary school by their classroom teachers. The students are then invited to redo the surveys in Grades 10 & 12 prior to completing their class selection sheets. There is also a parent portal in which parents can independently explore the program or they can join their child's account and explore it simultaneously. Here is the direct link <u>www.myblueprint.ca/stclair</u>. It is a very comprehensive tool for career planning. The UCC guidance team will be "blitzing" the student body next week wherein ALL the students will be entering the site and exploring.

#### 70 Uniform Discussion - Mary Ann McCrae

Ms. McCrae shared that the administrative team has been having discussions with the students and understands that many students have shared that they are not comfortable in their pants, specifically. Administration is working closely with McCarthy's and are asking for parent volunteers to be a voice and help approve some upcoming potential uniform changes from McCarthy's. All parents are asked to have discussions with their children to remind them that they must dress appropriately based on the weather. \*\*Reminder: Classes often take 'breaks' outdoors throughout the day with their classes, so pants are necessary during the winter/cold months. Wearing non-uniform pants over uniform shorts is not approved. Administration is trying very hard to reach common ground with the students. McCarthy's is very motivated to listen to the concerns and possibly create new pieces which will be more comfortable and stylish for the students.

**Internet Safety Presentation Discussions** – **Cyber Bullying / Harassment** – Today's conference focussed on social media usage and its effect on students (cyber bullying/harassment). There were also discussions regarding vaping inside the school building (washrooms/changerooms).

## 9.0 Covid Related Updates:

**Update on Positive Cases and Isolation** - UCC has had 7 positive cases since September. Close contact tracing has required about half of each class to isolate however with more students vaccinated that number is dropping. We also average about 3 students per week being sent to isolation for families to pick up their child. To date, the work of UCC staff and students have been outstanding in preventing greater spread.

**Safety Protocol Expectations** – Frequent hand washing / sanitizing, cleaning high touch points, promoting physical distancing, mandatory masks (staff and students) when indoors and in Main Driveway bus loading zone.

It is imperative that families and staff use the Ontario Self-Assessment Tool prior to attending each day.

**Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test - Course / EQAO / Community Service Hours** - OSSLT for grade 11 students was written Nov 24 and the grade 12 non graduates wrote Nov 25. Grade 11 students will write in the spring. Literacy support for both staff and students is provided by Ms Magliaro.

EQAO grade 9 math test will be held in mid January. A portion of the test will be used towards the Grade 9 math mark.

Community service hours have been reduced to 20 for 2021-2022 graduates.
