5.0 Principal Report - Lisa Harnarine

- Lisa shared the sad news that one of our Lancer family students (Gr. 12 student) passed away a week ago. Supports were made available to all of the students and staff to help deal with this tragedy. Future ceremonies are being organized to honour the student
- School Census Survey- Student Voice is so important. Students were asked to identify any barriers to them through an email/survey regarding Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Through the MyBlueprint program students completed these surveys.
- September Plans: eLearning vs. virtual school vs. summer school
 - eLearning: Government mandated that students will complete 2 courses. They are teacher-led but are completed asynchronously. This is not the same model of learning as our Virtual School. More information will be sent out to families.
 **NOTE: Families are able to opt-out of eLearning courses. Forms are available on the SCCDSB website and are then handed in to the Guidance Department upon completion.
 - 2. Summer School- courses are delivered asynchronously. Students may work at their own pace.

Retention Projections-

79.5 % of the Grade 8 students in SCCDSB elementary schools (237 of 298 available)

The total projection for feeder and non-feeder enrollment is 284. (A little bit smaller of a group but still a healthy number of students)

Lancer Head Start-

This three day, 12-hour interactive opportunity introduces students to a two-hour numeracy activity, followed by a two-hour elective activity including Technology, Foods, Arts, Physical Education and the Arts.
