Principal's Message

With March break behind us, and spring officially here, you can sense the last third of our school year will pass as quickly as it has arrived.

I am hopeful that warm weather finds us soon as everyone is itching to move outside a bit more regularly. By now I hope your child has had a conversation about course selection and the "My Blueprint" online course selection and planning tool. Guidance staff have been in-servicing students through February and March teaching the students how to go in and review their profile. It identifies all the courses they have taken to date, provides them opportunity to select their courses for 2019-2020, and then offers tools for career and pathway planning. It is a great resource for our students and you as parents to learn about post-secondary opportunities for your child. The goal is that all students use this tool to select course for next year. All students who have yet to complete course selections now need to visit this guidance counsellor so that I can start developing the master timetable for 2019-2020. Please ask your child to make sure they contact guidance immediately if they feel a course change needs to be made.

April 17th, from 4 pm to 7 pm we will be holding our Parent Teacher Interviews. No appointments are necessary however we welcome your to attend with (or without) your child to discuss their semester 2 progress to date. Interim report cards were sent home the week of March 18 – 22. Please contact your child's classroom teacher if they did not receive one. The hope is that these interviews allow some additional time for students to make academic improvements prior to midterm reports being sent home on April 25th.

Another event that has been keep staff and students busy is Muskoka Woods. Our student leaders and staff will conclude their months of preparation by putting their training to practice with our grade seven elementary students May 3-7th. We wish everyone involved a wonderful experience.

Catholic Education week is May 5 – 11th. A group of UCC students will be joining the Ursuline Sisters in celebrating mass on Tuesday May 7th. This is part of a province wide Eucharistic celebration.

Throughout this year, our school has been working on the developing the Ontario Catholic Graduate Expectations. Each day our chaplaincy leader Thomas Dula has shared examples of how we are called to be Discerning Believers, Effective Communicators, Reflective, Creative, Holistic Thinkers, Self-Directed, Responsible Lifelong Learners, Collaborative Contributors, Responsible Citizens, and a Caring Family Member.

What impresses me is the awareness that so many of our students have as to how the catholic graduate expectations are part of their daily lives at UCC. In my learning conversations with students, I am intrigued by the insight our students have of the impact they can make in another person's life. Understanding and living the catholic graduate expectations are life-long tools we hope all our students develop over their time at UCC.

Finally, I want to congratulate all the students who recently completed the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test. It is an important graduation requirement for all our students and I know it brings with it great stress and anxiety. I was proud of the student's efforts and certainly want to thank all the efforts by staff and students to prepare in advance for the test. It has been a school focus to enhance literacy and numeracy skills across the curriculum. Now we anxiously await the results.

APRIL SCHOOL NEWSLETTER ARTICLE Catholic Education: Living as Joyful Disciples

This year's Catholic Education Week theme is "Living as Joyful Disciples."

The 2019 theme was inspired by three sources: Renewing the Promise, The Pastoral Letter on Catholic Education from the Bishops of Ontario; Gaudete et exsultate, the Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis on the Call to Holiness; and Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment, the October 2018 Synod of Bishops. Mindful of the Synod on Youth, the theme and sub-themes are very much directed to the young people in our schools, especially in their growth in holiness and their formation as disciples of Christ through the discernment of their vocational pathways. In the section of Renewing the Promise entitled, "A Community that Forms Joyful Disciples," we read, "Our Catholic schools help to form joyful disciples as hearts and minds are opened to the transforming love of God and to the flame of faith in action. On a daily basis, Catholic schools demonstrate the joy of believing and witness the Good News to the communities that they serve."

There are five sub-themes for each day of Catholic Education Week:

Think before you click!

Really think about the photos, comments, messages and videos you want to post online, *before* you put them there.

Remember that things you post may not be private.

Everything is shareable. People can copy comments, messages, photos and videos that you post online and send them to other people.

Know who your friends are.

If you don't know someone in person, then you can't be sure who that person is online.

Protect your privacy with passwords

It's important to password-protect your mobile device; use strong passwords on your accounts and don't share them with others.

Respect your friends' online footprints too.

Before you post a photo or video with someone else in it, ask them if it's okay; and think carefully about what you say about others online.





If you're worried about something you see online, or have questions about how to protect your privacy, talk with an adult you trust.















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
