18 Compulsory Credits 40 Hours of Community Service
12 Optional Credits The Provincial Literacy Requirement

Notes:

1. **Community Service Hours must be completed and submitted by February 2, 2018**
2. Repeated courses do not count as additional credits
3. University-bound students are required to take a minimum of six 4U or 4M courses. Please check program pre-requisites.
4. SHSM students should check if they have met course, co-op and certification requirements.
