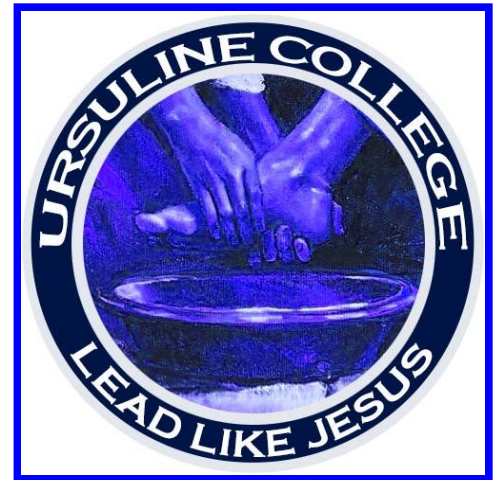
# LEAD LIKE JESUS



There is so much to learn about black history right in our own backyard. There are three excellent places to visit for a look into the past: The Buxton National Historic Site and Museum, The Chatham Kent Black Historical Society and Uncle Tom's Cabin Historic Site.

Between 1840 and 1860, enslaved Africans followed the North Star on the Underground Railroad to find freedom in Canada.

This was not a railroad but was actually a secret network of people, routes and safe houses that helped people escape slavery and reach the US northern free states and Canada. In the late 1800's, Chatham-Kent was a destination for these fugitive slaves seeking freedom and hoping for a better life. The Underground Railroad was the largest anti-slavery freedom movement in North America, having brought between 30,000 and 40,000 fugitive slaves to Canada.



UCC had the privilege of welcoming Dr. Bryan Walls, historian, author, and lecturer, to speak to Lancers about Black History Month. Dr. Walls shared with us his ancestry and the story of how his great-great grandfather, John Freeman Walls, escaped slavery because of his courage, strong faith, and the actions of good people. Dr. Walls' highlighted the importance of the Underground Railroad in Canadian History but also in today's society.



Mr. Dula reminds us that the Underground Railroad represents that different nations of people have escaped slavery throughout history, and that our world continues to struggle with various forms of slavery in contemporary culture. Canadian Black History continues to be recognized at UCC with the help of a senior student, Amani Zantoko, who has organized many of our reflections and celebrations.

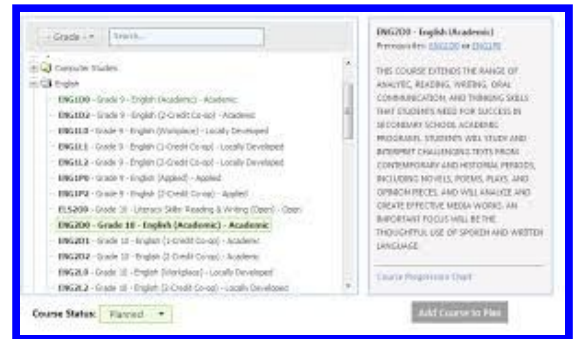

# CURRICULUM CONCENTRATION



In February, there is an emphasis on studies in the past, present and in the future. At the start of February, we completed our final exams from semester one, began our new classes for semester two, and students in grade 9 through 11 will soon start selecting their courses for the 2019-2020 school year.

In order to help with decisions, our guidance department will visit classrooms to discuss the advantages of using MyBlueprint. This is the online software tool that students use to make these course selections. An important part of this selection is pathway planning. Students need to seriously consider what their future story looks like.



Mr. Power strongly suggests that parents take the time to discuss these plans with their Lancer. Discussing future goals and the pathway plans required to reach those goals helps students determine their best course selections. Mr. Power advocates that these discussions between parents/guardians and students will take some of the anxiety out of making these important decisions. It is important to note that the courses selected in MyBlueprint in the coming weeks will determine what courses are offered at UCC next year.

# THOUGHTEXCHANGE

On January 9th and again on February 15th, I had the honour of attending the Thoughtexchange workshops at our CEC. Mrs. Crawford was pleased to share that more than 2,300 from our SCCDSB family shared 3, 344 thoughts, and
